## Analysis detail

### Top five lowest paying industries where young women are concentrated

The top five list of low-paying industries where young women are concentrated is subjective, depending on whether we are more concerned with, e.g., absolute numbers of young women in the sector, or hourly pay in the sector, or some combination of factors, etc. Considering absolute values and rank, the following 6 industries might be described as worst offenders:

- Health and social work \*
- Wholesale, retail, repair of vehicles
- Accommodation and food services
- Other service activities
- Admin and support services
- Arts, entertainment and recreation

The following table shows actual values, and rank (in brackets) among 21 industry sectors, across several measurements. Industries are ranked **worst to best**. All of the top five employers of young women rank among the ten worst paid in all three low pay measures.

<sup>\*</sup>Health and social work, however, is perhaps an odd one out, since the pay here is a bit higher across all measures. Around 81% of health and social care employees are female, while the gender balance across the industry generally is close to 50/50 in the other five sectors listed.



### Top five industry pay gaps

The industries with the highest (absolute) gender gaps in median **hourly** pay, for everyone (left), and just for young people (right), are:

Financial and insurance	8.19	Electricity, gas, air cond. supply	2.06
Education	5.13	Financial and insurance	2.06
Prof., scientific and technical activities	4.88	Mining and quarrying	1.91
Electricity, gas, air conditioning supply	4.55	Other service activities	1.79
Information and communication	4.42	Prof. scientific, technical	1.34

For the purposes of measuring fairness of pay between genders in an industry, net of the hours people tend to work within that industry, we would consider median hourly pay to be the better measure.

However, for information, four and three industries respectively also feature (shaded) in the corresponding top fives of absolute annual pay gap:
